

Our 36th Year

A Jewel in Our Own Backyard - The Louisiana State Exhibit Museum



Last month's newsletter had some examples of beautiful old Shreveport postcards. While looking through the postcard collection at LSU's Noel Memorial Library Archives & Special Collections, your Editor saw the postcard shown above. Although the artist took some hand-painting liberties with the purple columns and clouds, the overall image is striking. Credit for the photo was given to Pierre J. Le Doux (1899-1969), a prominent Shreveport photographer with a studio at 615 Jordan Street.

The Louisiana State Exhibit Museum was completed in 1939 as one of the New Deal's Public Works projects, and is an architectural jewel built in the ultra-modern style of the time. The circular building is home to 23 scale dioramas that portray a snapshot of Louisiana life in the 1940s. LSEM's collection includes Louisiana Native American artifacts, regional and national history artifacts, original works by local artists, and natural history exhibits. The four panel fresco on the North portico was painted by Conrad Albrizio during the summer of 1938. The artist selected two monumental iconic figures – female and male – to represent contrasting Agriculture and Industry of the state of Louisiana. The side panels illustrate the predominate activities in North and South Louisiana. Designed to face U.S. Highway 80, Greenwood Road, the artwork introduces the visitor to the thematic content of the museum itself – a celebration of Louisiana's labor and economy – hallmarks of the Depression Recovery movement. It is open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday thru Friday, and admission is free. It is located at 3015 Greenwood Rd. in Shreveport.
